HOUSING

All students stay in modern air-conditioned host homes near Wheaton Academy. All host families have been recruited, approved, trained, and supervised by Wheaton Academy. Students will be closely supervised and parented by Wheaton Academy host families during the entire class portion of the program.

FOOD

Students will eat breakfast daily in the host home and will enjoy a variety of catered food for lunch and dinner on Wheaton Academy's campus. Wheaton Academy offers spacious dining areas and meals include fresh vegetables and fruit, traditional American food, and Asian-themed dishes.



INSURANCE COVERAGE

Comprehensive medical and travel insurance is included in the price of attending SEI. In the unlikely event a student becomes ill or is injured, the insurance policy covers medical for illnesses or injuries which occur while the student is at SEI. * ADVISORY GROUPS | NEW THIS YEAR *

Modeled after Wheaton Academy's Advisory Program, SEI advisory groups are faculty/staff-led small groups of students committed to providing individual support and guidance in the areas of academics, future goal-setting, college planning, school culture, and leadership.

Groups meet daily and offer students the opportunity to grow and develop relationships with their peers as well as their advisor. Through this guidance and support, students learn to achieve excellence as well as find places to serve and discover their gifts. Everything from the responsible use of social media to our college-ready character traits of perseverance, social intelligence, self-control, gratitude, passion, and hope is covered by our Advisory Curriculum.







SEI CURRICULUM

PLACEMENT INTO CLASSES

Students are placed into classes based on the following available criteria:

- WA Global Network's assessment, a consultation conducted via Skype or Wechat to determine
 - · student's English and academic skills
 - · student interests and intended college major
- Group interview assessment at an SEI meeting in the student's home country
- · An itep or TOEFL score when available
- · Years of English study

SPECIALIZATION BY AGE AND ENGLISH LEVEL

SEI students are separated into middle school and high school groups, and further separated by English level ability.

INTEREST-BASED LEARNING

Because all students learn better when studying something they are interested in, many of our SEI classes and experiences give choices to students.

TYPES OF CLASSES

SEI includes both **English Core** and **English Elective classes**. Core English classes include focus on reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Elective English classes continue to work on improving English skills while focusing on a wide range of topics.

OFF-CAMPUS OUTINGS & FIELD LEARNING

EVENINGS


ACTIVE LEARNING TRAVEL IN CHICAGO

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

MENTORING PROGRAM

If your student could benefit from additional personal instruction in a key area, consider the SEI 1-to-1 Mentor Program. Students are provided individual mentoring throughout SEI by our outstanding staff that can be life changing.

SAMPLE 1-TO-1 MENTOR PROGRAMS

- College Guidance: teaches the students how to develop a personal "marketing plan" to give them a great opportunity at outstanding American universities.
- **Health, Nutrition & Fitness:** teaches the student the life time habits of a physically fit and healthy person.
- Confidence and Communication: teaches the shy and timid student how to grow their confidence, become a self-advocate and effectively communicate in all situations.
- Leadership: teaches the student with leadership inclinations to convert their potential into reality even as a teenager.
- Social Skills: teaches the student who might find it difficult to make or keep friends how to establish and maintain meaningful friendships.
- Technology Use: teaches the student who might have challenges to make good time and content decisions with the use of technology how to get this potentially addictive area of their life under control.

BOOK YOUR FLIGHTS

Students must arrive in Chicago O'Hare International Airport (ORD) between 6:00a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 25. The student's family is responsible for all international flights.

Students returning to their home country after SEI must schedule flights to depart from Chicago O'Hare on Saturday, August 8 between 6:00am and 7:00pm.

ADULT CHAPERONES

Students may fly with an adult chaperone and a group of other students from select cities. Specific cities and flight information is available upon request from WA Global Network. Get connected to a trusted adult and other students to make sure the trip from China to America is stress-free. Families are still responsible for purchasing their flights individually.

Register for SEI 2020 by following these simple steps!

- 1. Submit an Application online at waglobalnetwork.org A hard copy of the application is available upon request
- 2. Submit Supporting Documents Passport copy & current picture of student
- 3. Sign Enrollment Contract & Make Full Payment Sign contract and make payment (bank wire or credit card) within 10 days
- 4. Video interview for English assessment & class selection A 10-minute video or in-person interview
- 5. Schedule Visa Appointment Obtain your B-2 Visitor Visa
- 6. Send Immunization Records You must send your immunization records no later than May 31.
- 7. Buy Flights and Submit Travel Information Purchase flights between April 16 and May 31, 2020
